
#### DRY SEASON – June, July, August, September, and October

These months are much cooler where the temperature is around 73°F. There is very little rain and humidity during these months which makes it a great time to visit the beaches. Things to pack while visiting during the dry season include sandals, shorts, capris, teeshirts, and tanks. Don't pack too much warm clothing, you will be fine with just 1-2 pairs of pants and long-sleeved shirts or light sweaters. Also, don't forget a hat, sunglasses, and sunscreen. Temperatures average between 73°F to 82°F (23°C to 28°C)

### FAQ ABOUT TRAVEL IN KENYA

#### 1. Is it safe to visit Kenya?

Compared to other African countries, Kenya is relatively safe. However, you should check with your government's national travel advisory before planning a trip. Exercise street smarts in the day and avoid going out at night.

#### 2. Do I need a visa?

While there are some countries whose nationals don't require a visa to enter Kenya, if you are coming from the US, Canada, Europe, Australia and many non-African countries, you will need a visa. Check with the Kenya High Commission for the complete list of countries that are visa exempt.

#### 3. Do I need vaccinations?

Common vaccinations required for a trip to Kenya are hepatitis A, hepatitis B, rabies and typhoid, diphtheria, polio, measles, and yellow fever. It is best to consult with a doctor for vaccinations that you will need specific to your trip.

#### 4. Can I drink tap water?

No, you can only drink boiled or bottled water.

#### 5. Is English spoken in Kenya?

Yes, Kenya's two official languages are English and Swahili.

#### 6. What currency is used in Kenya?

The Kenyan shilling is used as currency although, on safari, many national parks will also take USD.

#### 7. How much money should I bring?

Kenya is a fairly expensive country. On a low budget, expect to pay around \$100/day. For Midrange to high budgets, \$100-\$250 a day is the norm.

#### 8. Where are the best places to see wildlife?

In Kenya, there is an abundance of wildlife. Some of the best places include Amboseli, Lake Nakuru, Tsavo west, Maasai Mara, and Nairobi National Park.

#### 9. What is the Big Five?

The Big Five refers to the most popular as well as some of the most challenging animals to spot on safari. These animals include elephant, lion, buffalo, rhino, and leopard.

#### 10. What else is there to do in Kenya besides safari?

Hike Mount Kenya, have breakfast with giraffes at Giraffe Manor, relax on Kenya's beautiful coastal sandy beaches, scuba dive or snorkel with abundant sea life, visit coffee and tea plantations, and try out the local cuisine!

### **OUR STORY**



Born and raised in Ghana, West Africa, I left home 18 years ago to pursue higher education at BYU-Idaho and later earned a bachelor's degree in Technology Systems from Utah State University. After several years in Utah with my family, I felt a deep calling to give back. Witnessing the struggles of children in Mepe, my late mother's village, I was inspired by her vision of education as the key to opportunity. Dreamers Wish Foundation was created in her honor—with the mission to educate, empower, and elevate students by providing the tools and resources they need to develop skills that solve local challenges. This is my mother's legacy.

During the pandemic four years ago, that vision became a reality with the launch of Dreamers Wish Foundation. What began as a response to the needs of one village has since grown to serve rural communities in Ghana, Kenya, and refugee families in Utah. Our work is rooted in STEAM education, equipping children with the knowledge and confidence to thrive in a rapidly changing world.

To date, we have impacted more than 8,000 young dreamers through robotics, ICT training, and vocational programs. Many are now the first in their families to graduate high school and pursue college—proof that when children are given a chance, they rise.

This progress has only been possible through the generosity of friends, board members, business partners, 50+ volunteers, and donors. ### WHAT WE NEED

For Mijomboni School (1200 students, 11 teachers, K-12, Rural Village in Watamu, Kenya)

#### 1. Classroom Refurbishment

- Building Materials: Cement, sand, gravel, paint, primer, brushes, rollers, and ladders
- Furniture: 50 desks. 50 chairs, teacher's tables, and cabinets
- Structural Repairs: Wooden beams, roofing sheets, nails, and window repairs
- · Electrical Work: Light fixtures, wiring, switches, sockets, and fans
- Supplies: Whiteboards, markers, erasers, and bulletin boards

#### 2. Mural Installation

- Art Supplies: Weather-resistant paint, brushes, rollers, stencils, spray paint
- Creative Resources: Inspirational quotes, educational illustrations (science, math, history themes)
- Volunteers: Artists, local students, and community members

#### 3. ICT Training

- Equipment: 30 laptops, projector, screen, printer, router, internet access setup
- Security & Infrastructure: Secure storage, grill windows, power stabilizers, backup batteries
- Software & Resources: Coding software, educational apps, digital literacy curriculum
- Training Support: ICT instructor, manuals, teacher stipends for ongoing training



### WHAT WE NEED

#### 4. Agricultural Sustainability Workshops

- Farming Tools: Hoes, rakes, watering cans, seed trays, compost bins
- Seeds & Plants: Local vegetable and fruit seeds, tree saplings for reforestation
- Irrigation Support: Water storage tanks, drip irrigation kits
- Training Materials: Books, posters, demonstration videos, hands-on workshops
- Instructor Support: Agricultural expert for knowledge sharing

#### 5. Robotics Workshops

- Robotics Kits: 20 programmable robotics kits (Vex Robotics, LEGO Mindstorms, Arduino, or Raspberry Pi)
- Computers/Tablets: 20 tablets or laptops for programming practice
- Training & Curriculum: Coding books, step-by-step guides, robotics mentors
- Workspace & Safety: Workbenches, storage bins, safety goggles, and gloves

#### **Additional Needs**

Volunteer Support: Skilled trainers, teachers, artists, and workshop facilitators

Logistics: Transportation of materials, lodging for trainers, meals for local volunteers

Funding: Budget for repairs, training stipends, equipment, and program sustainability
